## GSRP/Head Start update

- Many classrooms have had to go virtual due to Covid.
- GSRP children have had a lot more face to face learning this year compared to last year.
- ECSs have been supporting the programs.
- Only 19 GSRP openings in the county.
- Children can enroll up until February 16th to be counted for funding purposes, but we continue to enroll after count.
- Head Start is required to have 100% of their staff and anyone serving children be vaccinated.
- Salvation Army blended Head Start/GSRP classroom will be closing. Classroom will officially close Jan. 27th.

- We will make sure all of the children are offered a preschool spot somewhere else.
- We will be launching the enrollment form for fall sometime in February.

## 0-3 work

- Bridget and Kelly have a meeting scheduled with WIC.
- Will work on partnering with Early Head Start
- Providing information to GSRP families with younger children.
- Early Head Start playgroups were held at parks over the summer, December were being held at First Presybyterian Church in a nursery room, but now doing socialization virtual.
- Janine Head from Henry Ford Allegiance works closely with breastfeeding mothers.
